TO HELP PARENTS TEACH: These lesson sheets can be a burden instead of a help if they
are not properly used in your home study. How can we avoid this? Here are a few
suggestions that we have come up with from several years experience with them:

1) Each child who can read and write with ease should fill out his or her own
lesson sheet. When all the children in one family copy one set of answers, then only
one person gets much good out of the lesson--the one who writes the first set.

2) If your child cannot read or write, ask him the questions toward the end of
the week after he has heard the story enough times to know it well. Fill in the
lesson sheet with the child's words. Make sure the child feels that he has his own
lesson sheet and that he alone is responsible for the answers on it.

3) Let old children fill in the answers with as little aid from you as possible.
Tell them the story and study with them all week long. But encourage them to take
a Bible and search out their own answers. If their answers are occasionally wrong,
this will only spur them to study more carefully.
